William Adams enlisted in the U.S. Army Feb. 10, 1917. He sailed for France but after a few miles his ship was called back because the armistice was signed. He was then assigned to Camp Lee Va. where Corporal Adams died May 25, 1919 attempting to rescue a woman from a burning building. He was in the 62nd Infantry and died a hero. William was the son of Chester and Maude Brown Adams. After the death of his father, he was raised by his mother and step father George Freeman and was known as William Freeman. William was born in March of 1897. He is buried at Swamp Cemetery.
