Ralph Braun served the US Marine Corp, 10th Army, 24th Marine Corps. He fought in the Pacific Theater.

Herb Braun served in the US Army Air Forces. He was in the Pacific in the 10th Army 64th Anti-Aircraft battery. He served from June of 1943 to the end of the war. He was a light truck operator and worked with the 90MM guns. He helped clear sites for runways on many of the islands.

Werner Braun served in the US ARMY Air Force. He was in the 8th Army, 351st Bomber Group. He was shot down over Apeldoorn and was listed as a prisoner of war. He later escaped and was Missing in Action for a total of 13 months. A Canadian Tank division in Belgium helped him meet up with the US Army.

Walter Braun served in the US Navy. He was a Coxswain on LCI 982 in the South Pacific. Involved in the invasion of Leyte, Corregidor, Manila and Bataan. Spent time in the South China Sea.
